Professor Eduardo Henrique De Rose was born in Porto Alegre, Rio Grande do Sul, Brazil, on August 8, 1942, and in 1966, he began his professional career with a degree in Medicine, for the first class of the Federal School of Medical Sciences of Porto Alegre, now the Federal University of Health Sciences of Porto Alegre.

Actuallyy he is Professor Emeritus of the Federal University of Rio Grande do Sul, in Porto Alegre, RS, and Dean in the Court of Appeals of the Anti-Doping Justice, from the National Council of Sport, at the Ministry of Citizenship in Brasília, DF.

EXPERIENCE

In 2011 he received a Doctor Honoris Causa, from the Pontifical Catholic University of Rio Grande do Sul and in 2021 was elected by the International Federation of Physical Education the Professional of the Year.

At the Federal University of Rio Grande do Sul, he completed specialization in Medicine Applied to Physical Education and Sports in 1968; Physical Education, School Health and Recreation, in 1977; Physiology in 1980 and at the University of Cologne, Germany, he specialized in Sports Medicine in 1981. Already in 1982, at the University of Tours in France, he made a post-graduation in Biology and Sports Medicine. He holds a PhD from the Higher School of Physical Education, the University of Cologne, Germany, and the Faculty of Medicine at La Sapienza University in Rome, Italy.

He is a founding member of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), which has participated since 1999 on the Foundation Council and the Health, Science and Medicine Commission. In the Brazilian Olympic Committee (COB) he was a member of the Medical Commission from 1970 to 2016.

He was a member, vice president, secretary and president for eight years of the International Federation of Sports Medicine (FIMS) of which he is currently President of Honor. He was awarded the Knighthood of the Order of the Italian Republic, Medals of Sports Merit (awarded by the Brazilian government and Côte d'Ivoire), Necklace of the Olympic Order (IOC), Philip Noel-Baker Research Award (International Council of Sport Science and Physical Education) and Pan American Necklace (ODEPA).
